## TSA Student Members Embrace the 2025 National TSA Conference Theme, “Tune In To Technology”

**Nashville, Tennessee** — Approximately 10,000 middle school and high school **Technology Student Association (TSA)** members and other attendees from across the nation gathered at the Gaylord Opryland, June 27–July 1, 2025 in Nashville, Tennessee for the **47th National TSA Conference**.

The conference theme, Tune in to Technology, aligned with TSA’s competitions, activities, and programs that provide members with enhanced exposure to topics in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM); opportunities for personal and leadership development; and career awareness.

Highlights of the conference included:

- **TSA Middle School Competitions and High School Competitions** — Middle and high school student members competed in 70+ STEM competitive events.
- **TEAMS** — Middle and high school students were challenged by the Tests of Engineering Aptitude, Mathematics, and Science (TEAMS) competition, which featured the theme Engineering for Extreme Weather.
- **Junior Solar Sprint (JSS) and Senior Solar Sprint (SSS)** — JSS and SSS competitors designed, built, and raced solar-powered vehicles in the conference finals, administered by TSA and funded by the Army Educational Outreach Program (AEOP).
- **Spirit of Service** — Top TSA chapters and state delegations that raised money for the American Cancer Society were recognized.
- **Super Star Awards** — National recognitions were announced.
- **National TSA Officers** — The 2025–2026 school year national TSA officer team was installed:

- **Special Interest Sessions/State Officer Presentations** — Students and adults were able to attend presentations by both companies and state officer delegations.
- **TSA Meet and Greet** — Conference attendees networked with representatives from companies, universities, and non-profits that support STEM and IT education and careers.
- **Leadership Workshops** — Representatives of the Florida State University (FSU) STARS Leadership Corps conducted leadership sessions. Through a National Science Foundation grant, this group provides K-12 outreach across Florida and leads eight student organizations on the FSU campus to engage students in STEM careers and activities.
- **TSA Voices, Leadership Lessons from Alumni** — Conference attendees learned about this new leadership initiative, which will be officially launched in August 2025.

The next national TSA conference, featuring the theme Unity Though Community, will be held June 22-26, 2026, in the Washington, DC area at the Gaylord National, National Harbor, Maryland.
